Every once and while you run across information that you think maybe I should have known or why did I miss this? The following is one of those of those issues for me that maybe everybody else knows but I missed.

I have been attending car shows in the Central California area for many years. Through these years I have always admired the Chevrolet El Camino of which many really nice ones exist in this area. So why didn't Pontiac ever enter this market? The answer to this is that they tried to.

This began as an experiment in the Pontiac Engineering Department and came about when the engineering staff noted the apparent early success of the El Camino and the Ford Ranchero and decided to propose that Pontiac enter this market. Their design included using the front half of a standard, normal looking wide-track 1960 Catalina and the back half that resembled an El Camino pick up bed with 1960 Catalina body lines. This created the only Pontiac El Camino design ever made and it became known as the El Catalina. Unfortunately, the excitement of the Pontiac Engineers to build a Pontiac El Camino was not enough to carry this experiment into the real world. The top-level executives looked at the financial analysis of the venture and noted the comparatively small initial sales of both the El Camino and Ranchero and dropped the idea. Only two Pontiac El Catalina's were ever produced but neither was ever assigned a VIN. So, do they really exist?

Other ideas regarding the El Camino concept survived for a short while in the Canadian and to some degree the American GM markets. You might see one of them every once in a while. The GMC Caballero.

John Steinbeck's GMC Truck

You may recall that an article appeared in Smoke Signals a few months ago that highlighted the story behind John Steinbeck's book, Travels with Charlie. In that account, it was mentioned that Steinbeck ordered a new 1960 GMC pickup and had it modified plus the addition of a Wolverine slide-in camper.

Steinbeck then spent several months circumnavigating the country with his companion, a dog named Charlie. Upon returning from his travels, he wrote about the trip adding stories about the people and places he encountered along the way. He mentioned Charlie quite a bit and even praised his trustworthy GMC pickup which he named Rocinate, after the name of the horse Don Quixote rode on his adventures.


