PRESIDENTS MESSAGE-Sept 2023

When I began my 4th turn as President of POCC I thought about the most aggravating, spinning our wheels, types of concerns I have had with the club. Well, it was pretty easy. The first thing that came to mind was our continued fretting about Facebook and how and if the club could function with it or maybe even without it. Seems we have been off and on with this subject and always just kind of walked away and then, six months later we would repeat the same process. This was very irritating for all of us but it seemed that nobody really had the knowledge or willingness to tackle the issue to resolution. So, my first priority for the year was to resolve the Facebook issue or at least answer questions as to why it couldn't be resolved.

My first thought was that even though we've tried this several times, does somebody in the club have at least some of the knowledge needed to help us with this. However, the past continued to repeat itself and every active member was the same as me, none or only limited knowledge and not much inclination to learn and possibly take it on as a project. Considering this handicap, I went to our total club membership roster and checked the active membership as well as the not so active membership. My thought was that maybe somebody in the total membership including members living out of the area, may be willing to take this on, so I advertised the need-No takers. However, to my surprise one of our newer active members, Sheryl Hammans, came through and volunteered for this mission. After a fairly sketchy status report of what I knew about the history of our efforts and the people involved she was off and running. So, as we all know now, things are looking up in the Facebook world for POCC. Thank you, Sheryl.

My second concern was what to do about the club website. Brian Massey did a great job starting and designing the website from scratch and then managing it for many years. When Brian and Janet moved to Montana, we began another never-ending thought process on what we could do with the website and who would do it and how much we may have to pay for it. As with our previous efforts with Facebook, we never really came to any definite conclusion and Brian finally agreed to continue to manage the site by remote control and emails from Montana. As we have learned over time, the easy way out is not always the best. Brian did as good of job as we could expect but being remote was difficult to assure accuracy and timely management of the website. However, one day when I tried to log into our website it wasn't there and it was kind of like it never was there! I immediately contacted Brian and he began researching the issue and discovered that the absence of the website was fatal. It was gone forever! The current host had canceled all websites based on Microsoft Front Page software due its age (20 years) and lack of continued support and updates from Microsoft. All that remained was what Brian had in his files which would not even run on the higher Windows versions of the more modern systems. So here we were again with a problem very similar to the Facebook issue, not necessarily in the technology sense but with our "kick the can down the road" philosophy.

As I was floundering around trying to figure out which direction we should take for our website my son, Brent, told me that he had roughly configured the start of a possible website for us at the time Brian had left town. Since I had told him that we had already accomplished that mission, he dropped it. However, after reviewing what he had previously done I asked him if he could move forward with at least a "barebones" design of a website for the club. Utilizing website software that is current, he created the first version of the site within a day or two and we are now moving forward. To help in the process Brian provided many well-organized files containing past newsletters and lots and lots of past activity pictures. All of the newsletters have been put on the website and some pictures. After the completion of the activities schedule on the new website, we will be substantially done with the site other than on going updates and improvements.




